For all the Saints

All Saints Church in Handcross was originally built as a hall from which Sunday School and other activities for children could be run. In the early 1900s, it was consecrated as a church and since then it has been a place of worship attached to the parish of St Mary's Slaugham as a chapel of ease (a church building that isn't the main parish church).

When I first arrived in the parish in 2017, it would be fair to say that All Saints had been a little bit neglected. It was a building that because of issues with damp, difficult access due to the introduction of the A23, and the noise of the traffic, was only being used for occasional mid-week services and lunches.

In 2018, we had a big clear out of all the clutter that had gathered there and began to use the building more, by re-introducing a toddler group there, having the church open to the public for prayer, and eventually developing the Handcross Community Pantry and Café on Saturday mornings. There has been, and still remains, a desire to develop the building to improve the access, but the COVID-19 pandemic and rising building costs have made that a hard dream to bring into reality.

However, a few weeks ago we received an offer from someone to decorate the inside of All Saints. Since then, this beautiful, small church has been lovingly decorated with fresh paint, the removal of some of the clutter, and the introduction of fresh lighting and worship equipment. As some of the woodwork was being sanded to be painted, some words were discovered around the whole of the inside of the building. A bit of research in the Slaugham Archives revealed a black and white photo of the inside of All Saints before all the artwork and wording was painted over. (We also found some great photos of a group of young people painting the Church in 1960.) We discovered that the words down one side were the words of a hymn:

For all the saints

Who from their labours rest

Who thee by faith before the world confessed

Thy name of Jesus, be forever blest

Alleluia, Alleluia

We couldn't help but have these words restored in gold, and so they lovingly were. But as we were doing this, we found that conversations were beginning to happen around people's memories of being in that church in the past, either in Sunday School or in their youth, and it felt as though as we were loving the building back into life – people were finding life within its walls again.

And so on 26th February, we started a new Sunday evening church in All Saints – a church in Handcross for the people of Handcross and surrounding area.

So now All Saints is springing into life again and there are lots more opportunities for people to come to the church for life, community, fellowship and worship. There is still more decorating to be done, and we would still love to make the building more accessible for those who can't manage the steps, but as we love the building more, our hope is that more people find the things that really matter when they enter this church.
