Grace and Peace

The art of letter writing is something that we are seeing less and less of. More people are turning to emails and typed letters for convenience and accuracy. I find it is very rare now that I receive a hand-written letter, so when I do, it feels almost like a treat.

The New Testament in the Bible is largely a collection of what would originally have been hand-written letters, written (in most cases) by Paul. In writing to the churches, Paul would be encouraging them, teaching them, helping them, at times rebuking them, informing them and asking them for support. Each of Paul's letters had a specific context, they were written to specific individuals or churches gathering in people's homes, and so although there are common themes, each letter is unique.

But one thing that is common in most, if not all, of Paul's letters is the term 'Grace and Peace'. Paul would often begin his letters praying that the recipients would know and experience grace and peace. This wasn't just a pleasant greeting or formality, he was asking for something which he considered to be very important and even life changing.

Paul (formally called Saul) was changed completely by an experience he had of the risen Jesus. It's an amazing story if you want to read it (Acts 9vs1-19). Paul knew that this experience was only possible because of the love and grace of God. Grace is essentially things that God does for us and gives to us that we don't deserve. In Paul's case, this was forgiveness for the wrong things he had done to Christians and a chance at a new life with Jesus. His life was completely changed by God's grace.

He also wanted people to know peace. In his life as a Christian, Paul had been arrested, beaten, threatened, put on trial, shipwrecked and had faced many challenges, but still he knew peace. Paul knew that true peace was not the absence of difficult circumstances but was the presence of Jesus. When Paul was praying for people to know peace, he was praying that they would know that Jesus was with them in all things.

So, wherever you are, whatever you are facing in life, whatever joys or sorrows you are experiencing, whatever your plans for the future, like Paul, I pray that you can know and experience the life-changing Grace and Peace of God. If you want to but don't know how, feel free to get in touch.
