### Our verses for 2023: Romans 12:9-13

Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practise hospitality.

### **Transition and Change**

Walking through the woods with our dog the other day felt a little strange. It was the end of one of the really hot days in September, yet on the ground were freshly fallen acorns – these two things just didn't go together in my mind – a hot summer's day with signs of autumn! It felt as though the transition from summer to autumn was very sudden.

There are times in our lives that transitions and changes can come upon us more suddenly than we would like. Even though it can be a good thing for us, we all struggle with change, and the older we get the harder change becomes. And when change happens, we like to be able to prepare for it – but that's not always possible. A sudden loss, an unexpected redundancy, a relationship breakdown – all of these, when they happen suddenly, force change on us, rather than us choosing it. This can be painful, and learning to grieve well and to process that change well in these times is really important.

Then there are those times we want change but it doesn't come, and we have to learn to wait, to be patient or to grow in our acceptance of our circumstances.

The arrival of Jesus 2,000 years ago was neither sudden nor unexpected. It was something that the people of Israel had been awaiting for hundreds of years. In that time, they had been displaced, scattered and were being led by corrupt nations. They were eagerly awaiting someone to rescue them; enter Jesus, who would bring change, even if not in the way they would have expected — what He came to do was far more than any of them could have dreamed or imagined.

Although the way Jesus arrived into this world was gentle and humble, the change that He introduced when He began His ministry was much more sudden. Very quickly, He was beginning to teach and show things of God that challenged the status quo of the religious leaders, and they hated that change so much that they ultimately crucified Him for introducing it. Little did they know that in doing so they would be helping to bring about the most dramatic and sudden change in human history: the change of our relationship with God! This was the restoration and reconciliation of something that was broken, the forgiveness of our sin, and the hope of new life through the powerful resurrection – the fulfilment of those promises that people had been waiting for.

But that change is a little like the heat and the acorns. We live in a time where the Kingdom of God has come in Jesus and is being established (we see signs of it) but is yet to be fully known in the way that it will be when He comes again; but in this time of waiting, there is a greater hope, and life can be found in Jesus. He is leading us through this transition, and we know that what He has for us in the future is good because He is good! And in the meantime, He is changing us and calling us to partner with Him to care for the world.
