Dear Friends and Neighbours,

We all hear pleas for help from those who are poor and, quite rightly, Christmas is a season when the pressure to give becomes most acute.

Jen and I have a friend called "Rabecca" (not her real name) who lives in Uganda. This week we had a long WhatsApp call with another friend, Byaruhanga, through whom we are trying to support "Rabecca". "Rabecca" and her four children are in desperate need.

Let us tell you more about "Rabecca". This is *not* a plea for you to give her money – but *is* a plea to consider carefully what our response should be towards those in need within our own circles of awareness.

The answer is different for each of us.

"Rabecca" is the eldest of a family of five who were orphaned when young during a time of civil war. She took her responsibility seriously, supporting her younger siblings, helping them through school, feeding and clothing them while neglecting herself.

Then "Rabecca" had a break; a missionary sponsored her to train as a seamstress and she started to make money sewing and selling school and student uniforms. With others, Jen and I became involved, buying a sewing machine and materials for her.

She developed a customer base, got married, and gave birth to four children, then, in quick succession, her unfaithful husband abandoned her, the sewing machine was stolen and she developed a rare, potentially fatal, tumour in her jaw. Treatment cost over £10,000 (there is no NHS in Uganda) and involved complex surgery using bone from her leg to construct a new jaw.

"Rabecca" recovered, but her needs remain overwhelming.

Do we draw a line now, and say, "we've done our bit"?

A rich man came to Jesus asking, "what must I do to have eternal life?" Jesus' answer: "Sell everything you have, give to the poor, and follow me." (Mark Chapter 10:17,21)

That's a tough call! There are many like "Rabecca".

Mark told this story to show us what matters in life, what has eternal consequence, and to guide over our attitude to possessions.

How should we respond?
